Show who you are!

At the start of any interview, you will typically be asked to describe yourself.

All of us have unique skills, experiences and values that we can bring to an employer, but these are not always easy to talk about.

Skills and qualities developed from home, school, hobbies or other personal experiences are all valuable parts of yourself that employers are looking to learn about. MyStartr employers are often looking for personality, habits and values that match their company and team, even over years of experience.



Showing why you want to work for employers!

Answering behavioural questions at your interview

Employers will often ask interview questions where they ask you to reflect on past experiences in order to understand your behaviours and attitudes. These are called behavioural questions. These styles of questions can be easy to spot as they often start with:

Tell me about a time when...

Give me an example of...

What do you do when...

Have you ever...

Describe a time/situation when...

Use the STAR Method to Answer Behavioural Questions

The STAR method is a popular way to structure your answer to these styles of question. Memorize what STAR means and anytime you hear a question that starts with the words above, use each step of STAR to answer the question in detail.

Show you skills and skills and strengths!

S.T.A.R Method

Situation: Set the scene and give the necessary details of your

example.

Task: Describe what your responsibility was in that situation.

Action: Explain exactly what steps

you took to address it.

Result: Share what outcomes your

actions achieved.

Practice with the STAR Method

Below is a sample of behavioural style questions. Pick one question that you feel would be asked in your interview and on the next page work through your STAR answer.

"Describe a goal that you set for yourself. How did you plan to meet your goal?"

"Have you ever gone above and beyond the call of duty?

If so, how?"

"Describe a time when you had to work closely with someone whose personality was very different from yours. How did you work with that person?"

"Tell me about a time you failed to meet an expectation?


How did you handle the situation?"
